

Heroes of the Bible: (Rahab) Grafted into the Family Tree

Joshua 2:1-24

1 Then Joshua son of Nun secretly sent two spies from Shittim. "Go, look over the land," he said, "especially Jericho." So they went and **entered the house of a prostitute named Rahab and stayed there.** 2 The king of Jericho was told, "Look! Some of the Israelites have come here tonight to spy out the land." 3 So the king of Jericho sent this message to Rahab: "Bring out the men who came to you and entered your house, because they have come to spy out the whole land." 4 But **the woman had taken the two men and hidden them.** She said, "Yes, the men came to me, but I did not know where they had come from. 5 At dusk, when it was time to close the city gate, the men left. **I don't know which way they went.** Go after them quickly. You may catch up with them." 6 (But she had **taken them up to the roof and hidden them** under the stalks of flax she had laid out on the roof.) 7 So the men set out in pursuit of the spies on the road that leads to the fords of the Jordan, and as soon as the pursuers had gone out, the gate was shut. 8 Before the spies lay down for the night, she went up on the roof 9 and said to them, "**I know that the LORD has given this land to you** and that **a great fear of you has fallen on us**, so that all who live in this country are melting in fear because of you. 10 **We have heard how the LORD dried up the water of the Red Sea for you** when you came out of Egypt, and **what you did to Sihon and Og**, the two kings of the Amorites east of the Jordan, whom **you completely destroyed.** 11 When we heard of it, our hearts melted and everyone's courage failed because of you, for **the LORD your God is God in heaven above and on the earth below.** 12 Now then, please **swear to me by the LORD that you will show kindness to my family, because I have shown kindness to you.** Give me a **sure sign** 13 **that you will spare the lives of** my father and mother, my brothers and sisters, and all who belong to them, and that you will save us from death." 14 "Our lives for your lives!" the men assured her. "If you don't tell what we are doing, we will treat you kindly and faithfully when the LORD gives us the land." 15 So **she let them down by a rope through the window**, for the house she lived in was part of the city wall. 16 Now she had said to them, "**Go to the hills** so the pursuers will not find you. **Hide yourselves there three days** until they return, and **then go on your way.**" 17 The men said to her, "This oath you made us swear will not be binding on us 18 unless, when we enter the land, you have **tied this scarlet cord in the window** through which you let us down, and unless you have **brought your father and mother, your brothers and all your family into your house.** 19 If anyone goes outside your house into the street, his blood will be on his own head; we will not be responsible. As for anyone who is in the house with you, his blood will be on our head if a hand is laid on him. 20 But if you tell what we are doing, we will be released from the oath you made us swear." 21 "Agreed," she replied. "Let it be as you say." So she sent them away and they departed. And she tied the scarlet cord in the window. 22 When they left, they went into the hills and stayed there three days, until the pursuers had searched all along the road and returned without finding them. 23 Then the two men started back. They went down out of the hills, forded the river and came to Joshua son of Nun and told him everything that had happened to them. 24 They said to Joshua, "The LORD has surely given the whole land into our hands; all the people are melting in fear because of us."

Rahab's Story:

- Rahab was a sinner
- But at great personal risk she received and hid God's representatives
- Misled the King as to their whereabouts
- Showed great faith in this God that she had heard about
- Professed God as God of heaven and earth
- Trusted her life and her families life into the hands of God
- She was indeed spared by God when the city was captured

With faith like Rahab's you are ...

1. **GRAFTED INTO THE FAMILY TREE OF GOD HIMSELF**

In fact, Rahab is one of only 4 women listed in the genealogy of Christ.

Matthew 1:3-6

3 Judah the father of Perez and Zerah, whose mother was **Tamar**, Perez the father of Hezron, Hezron the father of Ram, 4 Ram the father of Amminadab, Amminadab the father of Nahshon, Nahshon the father of Salmon, 5 Salmon the father of Boaz, whose mother was **Rahab**, Boaz the father of Obed, whose mother was **Ruth**, Obed the father of Jesse, 6 and Jesse the father of King David. David was the father of Solomon, whose mother had been **Uriah's wife** (Bathsheba).

All but one was guilty of sexual sin.

Tamar – slept with father-in-law Judah (Gen. 38)

Rahab – prostitute, hid the spies in Jerico (Joshua 2)

Bathsheba – committed adultery with King David (2 Sam. 11)

Ruth – only one of 4 women not guilty of sexually sin (Ruth)

2. **CONSIDERED A HERO OF THE FAITH**

Hebrews 11:31

31 By faith the prostitute Rahab, because she welcomed the spies, was not killed with those who were disobedient.

3. **CONSIDERED RIGHTEOUS**

James 2:25-26

25 In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction? 26 As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.

4. **EXPERIENCE THE MERCY OF CHRIST**

- Christ came on "**Behalf**" of sinners
- He Himself was "**Born**" of sinners
- That He might "**Destroy**" the sins OF ALL
